## Day 1 – Arrival in Dubrovnik or Tivat / Kotor Bay

Upon arrival, guests are met and transferred to Kotor Bay.

The remainder of the day is at leisure—allowing time to settle in, enjoy the coastal setting, or take a relaxed walk along the waterfront.



## Day 2 – Kotor Bay Private Discovery



The day begins with a **private guided tour of Kotor Bay**, exploring its coastal towns and landscapes.

The experience includes a visit to Perast, followed by a short boat ride to **Our Lady of the Rocks**. The tour continues in **Kotor Old Town**, where a guide introduces its historic streets and architecture.

The combination of coastal scenery and cultural highlights makes this a well-rounded introduction to the bay.



## Day 3 – Montenegro Highlights: Mountains & Royal History



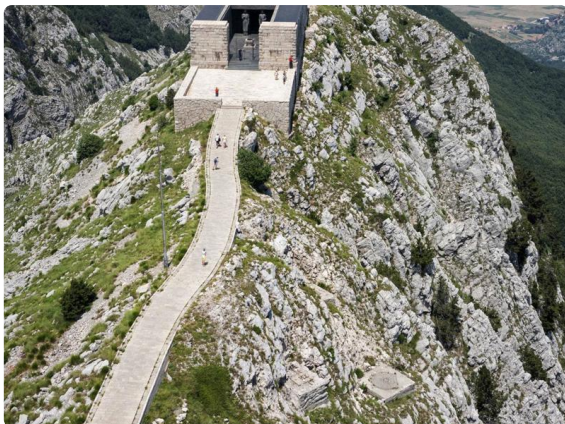
The day begins with a ride on the **Kotor Cable Car**, offering wide panoramic views over the Bay of Kotor as the landscape shifts from coastline to mountains.

The journey continues toward **Lovćen National Park**, where guests visit the **Njegoš Mausoleum**, set high above the surrounding peaks.

In the historic town of **Cetinje**, a **private guided tour** reveals its role as the former royal capital, including a visit to the **King Nikola's Palace**.

After time to explore and enjoy the atmosphere of Cetinje, the journey continues back to Kotor Bay.

The mix of coastal views, mountain landscapes, and cultural heritage makes this a well-rounded day across Montenegro.



## Day 4 – Budva



Transfer to Budva, one of Montenegro's most lively coastal towns.

Upon arrival, a **private guided tour of Budva Old Town** introduces its historic walls, narrow streets, and seaside setting. The walk offers a relaxed overview of the town's history and atmosphere.

Free time in the afternoon to enjoy the beach, explore the promenade, or relax at the hotel.



## Day 5 – Budva Leisure Day



The final day is left at leisure, allowing guests to enjoy Budva at their own pace.

Options include beach time, exploring nearby areas along the Budva Riviera, or simply relaxing before departure.



## Day 6 – Durmitor National Park / Žabljak



After breakfast, departure toward northern Montenegro.

The journey leads to Durmitor National Park, a region known for its dramatic mountain landscapes and alpine scenery.

Upon arrival in Žabljak, check-in and time to relax in a quieter, nature-focused setting.



## Day 7 – Durmitor Nature Experience



The day is dedicated to exploring Durmitor National Park.

A **guided visit to Black Lake** introduces one of the region's most iconic natural sites, followed by time for walking or light hiking in the surrounding area.

The experience can be complemented with:

- Visit to Tara Canyon viewpoints
- Optional outdoor activities such as rafting or hiking

## Practical Information



### Best Time to Visit

The ideal time to visit Croatia and Montenegro is from **May to October**, with warm weather, long days, and active coastal life. July and August are the busiest months, while May, June, and September offer a more relaxed experience.

### Currency

Both Croatia and Montenegro use the **Euro (€)**. Credit cards are widely accepted, but carrying some cash is recommended for smaller establishments.

### Weather

The Adriatic coast has a **Mediterranean climate**, with hot, dry summers and mild winters. Summer temperatures typically range between **25–32°C (77–90°F)**.

### Language

The official languages are Croatian and Montenegrin, but **English is widely spoken** throughout tourist areas.

### Getting Around

Private transfers, ferries, and catamarans connect key destinations across Croatia and Montenegro, making travel between cities and coastal areas smooth and efficient.

### Border Crossing

Travel between Croatia and Montenegro includes a **border crossing**, which is usually straightforward but may involve short waiting times during peak summer months.
