DETAILED ITINERARY

Day 01

Arrive Delhi

By: International Flight

Meeting and assistance on arrival at Delhi International Airport Terminal 03 and transfer to hotel.

Platinum guests receive a VIP jet-bridge greeting at Delhi International airport. An Airport Representative will meet you at the Aerobridge, and fast track you through immigration and customs. A Platinum by Trans India representative will escort you to the hotel and will arrange for immediate check-in.

Check-in at The Imperial Hotel (Grand Heritage Room – room booked from 1400 hours of this day).

Reminiscent of a 19th-century Indian Palace, in the land of Maharajas and Maharanis, The Imperial was opened in 1936 as the first hotel in Delhi. One of the Grand Dames of the East, its architecture has subtle traces of Victorian, Art Deco and Lutyen styles. White marble colonnades, verdant gardens and rooms & suites replete with Italian marble floors, polished Burma teak, Persian hand-knotted carpets, antique Chandeliers and Rosewood furniture, set the tone. The storied hotel blends rich heritage, exceptional service and modern-day comforts for today's leisure travellers.

India's seat of power saw many rulers, like the Lodis, Mughals and the British, all of whom left their legacies in the form of art and architecture throughout the capital. Colourful bazaars and historic landmarks sit side by side with quiet green spaces and charming neighbourhoods in New Delhi.

Rest of the day at leisure – enjoy hotel facilities Spa / pool or simply take a stroll nearby hotel.

Day 02

Delhi

Today morning after breakfast, proceed for a full day sightseeing of Old & New Delhi with your guide.

09:00 hours: Meet with your local expert / explorer cum guide for sightseeing tour of Old Delhi including cycle rickshaw ride.

The Old Delhi Private Rickshaw Tour offers a unique glimpse into the rich history of the city, showcasing its Mughal legacy and the hustle and bustle of daily life in the old city. Travelers get to experience the sights, sounds, and smells of Old Delhi's narrow lanes, ancient buildings, and





bustling markets. They can witness the centuries-old architecture that has withstood the test of time and remains a testament to Delhi's history.

One of the highlights of the **Old Delhi Private Rickshaw Tour** is the food tasting experience. Delhi is renowned for its culinary culture, and the tour takes tourists to some of the city's most famous food spots, where they can savour the local delicacies and experience the vibrant food culture of Delhi.

Visit the **Jama Mosque (Masjid)**, which is located on a mound in the heart of the old city and projects beautifully into the Old-Delhi skyline. Jama Masjid Mosque was built in red sandstone and marble by more than 5000 artisans.. (Note- Modest clothing required; robes available for visitors)..



After experiencing old Delhi, return to hotel for lunch break or you may explore local café (restaurant) for lunch. (**Suggested- Dariyaganj / Kwality in CP** on direct payment).

14:00hrs: Later after lunch, your local guide will meet & proceed towards New Delhi, driving past India Gate, Parliament House, the Secretariat buildings and the Vice Regal Palace, now the official residence of the President of India.

Next in New Delhi, visit the **Humayun's Tomb**.

Built in 1572, Humayun's Tomb is one of the most magnificent tombs built in Delhi during the Mughal rule. This UNESCO World Heritage Site is an excellent example of Persian and Indian architecture. The tomb is made with red sandstone along with use of white and black marble. It



was considered as the first and foremost garden style tomb in India. This tomb complex is also known as the 'Dormitory of the Mughals' as it houses more than a hundred graves from the Royal family.



Gurudwara Bangla Sahib – Built in the memory of the 8th Sikh Guru Sri Harkishen Sahib, Gurudwara Bangla Sahib is one of the important historical Gurudwara in Delhi. The large main hall is unelaborate except for the open central shrine, where a sculpted bronze cupola hangs over a smaller golden dome under which silk sheets are spread out and covered with flowers. This shrine is the scene of constant devotional music, whose ethereal tones are relayed throughout the entire





complex. *(Note- Modest clothing required, no skirt /shorts, cover knees, shoulders and head).*
Return to your hotel after the sightseeing tour. Rest of the evening at leisure.

Culminate your city tour with visit to Qutub Minar and enjoy an experiential walking tour of Mehrauli Archaeological Park.

Discover the 1st city of Delhi with us at dusk. The massive brick tower called Qutub Minar is probably the most easily recognized visual symbol & also the most visited tourist attractions of the city. Standing silent and strong against the changes in time & history, the journey around Qutub Complex can be really awe-inspiring. A stroll at Mehrauli Archaeological Park covers a historic site dotted with spectacular monuments from different eras, scattered all over 200 acres of lush greenery.



Return to hotel after visit.

Optional: Dinner at Olive Bar & Kitchen, Mehrauli (Beverages at own expenses).

Day 03

Delhi – Agra

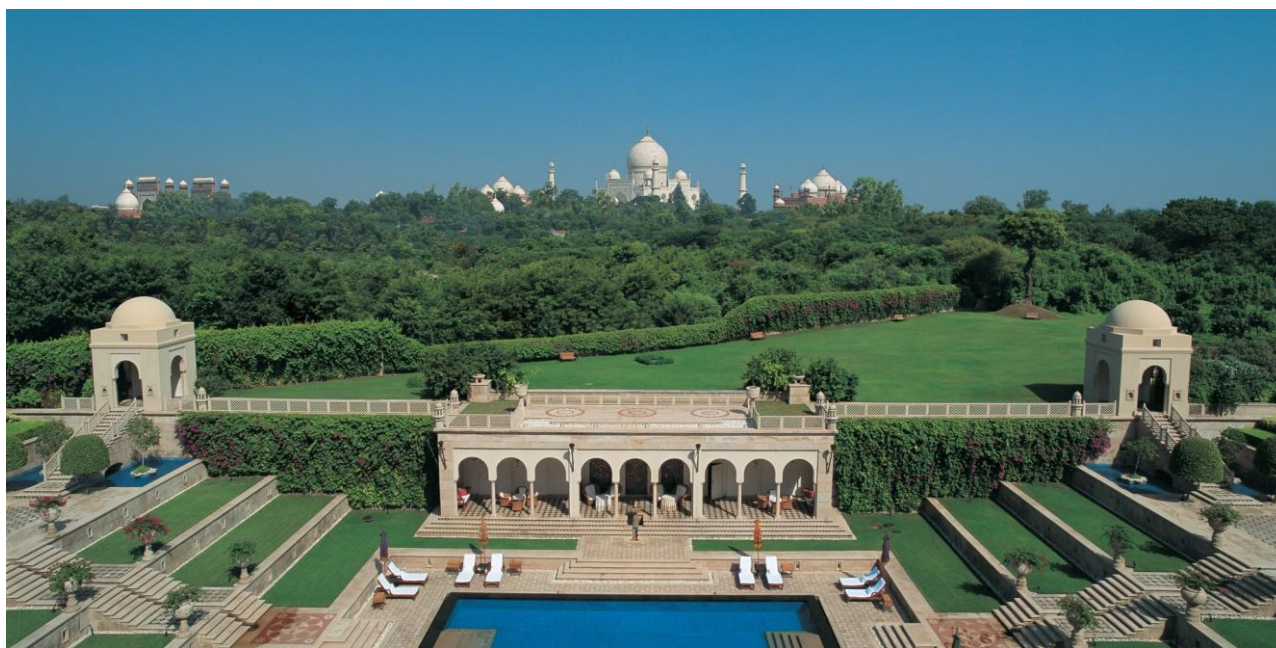


Breakfast at hotel.

08:30 hours: Transfer by road to Agra (approximately 04-hour drive).

Optional: Express train to Agra (Vande Bharat at 0600/0740hrs or Gatimaan Express at 0810/0950hrs (Gatimaan Does not run-on Fridays)).

Agra, situated on the banks of the Yamuna River in Uttar Pradesh, is the home of the iconic Taj Mahal which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site and also one of the Seven Wonders of the World. Agra has witnessed the rise of the pomp and pageantry of three great Mughal monarchs - Akbar, Jahangir and Shah Jahan. They transformed the land into one of the greatest centres of art, culture, learning and commerce. In modern times, the city of Agra is famous for its superb inlay work on marble, soapstone by craftsmen, carpets, gold thread embroidery and leather work.



Arrive and check in at **The Oberoi Amarvilas Hotel** (Premier Room with Balcony).

The hotel is located 600m from the Taj Mahal and your room offers breathtaking views of the monument from the comfort of your balcony.

1400 hours: Proceed to visit **Agra Fort**.

The Agra Fort, an outstanding example of Mughal architecture. Agra Fort - the seat and the stronghold of the Mughal Empire under successive generations. This was the seat of Mughal rule and administration and the present structure owes its origins to Akbar who erected the walls and gates and the first buildings on the eastern banks of Yamuna River.



Marble Inlay – As the sun rises over the bustling streets of Agra, the city awakens to the timeless beauty of marble. Nestled in the heart of India, Agra is renowned for its exquisite marble craftsmanship, a tradition passed down through generations. From the magnificent Taj Mahal to the intricate marble inlays adorning Mughal architecture, marble reigns supreme, casting a luminous glow over the city. Amidst this vibrant tapestry of sights, lies hidden gems of unparalleled beauty – the workshops of master artisans renowned for their magical marble inlay work.

Visit **Taj Mahal** (***Closed on Fridays***) at **Sunset**.

The Taj Mahal is everything that has been said about it and more. Taking 22 years and 20,000 men to build, the white marble was quarried 200 miles away and was transported to the site by a fleet of 1000 elephants. Built by the Mughal Emperor Shah Jahan as an expression of his love for his wife Mumtaz Mahal, in mid-17th century, the Taj Mahal is truly one of the wonders of the world.

Return to hotel after visit.

Rest of the evening is free to enjoy inhouse facilities at hotel.

Day 04

Agra – Chambal

Optional visit: Visit Taj Mahal (Closed on Fridays) at Sunrise.

Breakfast at hotel.

Check-out and drive to Chambal covering distance of 82 Kms in approx. 1.5hrs.

Upon arrival, check in at hotel.

The Chambal River is a 650-mile river flowing from the Vindhya Mountains of north central India eastward into the Jumna River. The Jumna in turn originates in the Himalayas and empties into the Ganges River. The Chambal is one of the few places remaining in India with enough unpolluted water that it can support Ganges River Dolphins.

Post lunch, in afternoon, you will proceed to visit Fort Ater and Bateshwar Temples.

Located on the periphery of the National Chambal Sanctuary, 2 km from the Chambal Safari base camp, lies Fort Ater. Once a valued stronghold and at the forefront of numerous battles between the Rajputs, the Mughals and the Marathas, the crumbling ruins bring alive the romantic glory of a bygone age. The ramparts of the fort afford some breathtaking views of the Chambal valley.

The ancient temple complex at Bateshwar on the river Yamuna, consists of more than a hundred temples dedicated to the Hindu God Shiva. Referred to as Surajpur in ancient texts, Bateshwar derives its current name from its reigning deity Lord Bateshwar Mahadev (another name for Shiva). The ravines surrounding the temples and river are home to a number of Naga sadhus (snake worshipping ascetics) who have carved out little caves and temples within the mud walls.





Holipura Heritage Walk

Holipura village, located at the edge of the Yamuna Ravines, near Bateshwar, is a stronghold of the Chaturvedi clan who claim descent from the Greek soldiers of Alexander's army. Many of the clan rose to positions of great prominence and built substantial havelis (grand homes) to announce their arrival. Built over a period of time, with influences ranging from Mughal to Colonial and adapted to a rural scenario, the havelis have a unique architectural blend and are a beautiful synthesis of myriad traditions. Several are inhabited by the descendants of the original owners, retaining a certain character and charm. The village is a microcosm of rural Indian life with the symbiotic relationships of the inhabitants reflected in its layout. The interactive walk through Holipura is conducted by a member of the village community, culminating in refreshments at his home.

Return to hotel. Dinner at hotel.

Day 05

Chambal

Early morning proceed for The River Safari.

The calm and gentle waters of the Chambal River are best explored on boats and the River Safari provides spectacular opportunities to view the wildlife. The Chambal Safari boatmen are exceptionally skilled at cutting the boat engines, and manoeuvring as close to the birds and animals





as possible without disturbing them. Trained naturalists accompany visitors and provide expert information on the Chambal wildlife. The River Safari is a most relaxing, enjoyable and special experience.

Return to hotel. Lunch at hotel.

Later proceed for **Blackbuck Jeep safari.**

This 3-4 hours Jeep Safari Jeep Safari heads southwest from the Lodge, about 30 km towards the Chambal Ravines, for excellent sightings of Blackbuck deer and numerous dry land birds including the Indian Courser. Driving and walking across agricultural fields set at the edge of the Chambal ravines, this safari is also a fascinating journey through remote hamlets and habitations.



Return to hotel after safari.

Day 06

Chambal – Ranthambore

Breakfast at Hotel

08:30hour: Check out and drive to Ranthambore (275 KM, approx. 7 hours).



Ranthambhore is the world's finest place to observe tigers in the wild and an ideal base to explore this billion-year-old forest, with the mighty citadel that lends its name to the reserve rising majestically at the heart of it. With ruins of palaces, cenotaphs and follies dotted around the jungle, now inhabited by its wild denizens, with the tiger at the apex, it is a spectacular wildlife haven.

On arrival in Ranthambore, check in at the hotel – **Sujan Sher Bagh – A Relais & Châteaux property**



Sher Bagh, evokes nostalgic sensibilities of life on safari during the heydays of an era celebrated for its art de vivre, living elegantly under canvas, whilst on safari. With crackling campfires under starlit skies, sumptuous Anglo-Indian repasts using homegrown organic produce, coupled with old-world service, the camp epitomises life on safari as it ought to be lived.

Rest of the evening is kept at leisure- time available to enjoy the hotel facilities or spa.

Dinner at hotel.

Day 07

Ranthambore



Morning proceed for private game drive (by jeep) into Ranthambore National Park. The morning safaris are usually from sunrise to about 10.00 am.



Ranthambore: The Ranthambore National Park is one of the major illustrations of the Project Tiger's conservation in Rajasthan. The Ranthambore National Park covers an area of over 400 sq. km. It has many sharp cliffs enfolding a route of lakes and rivers. The 10th century Ranthambore Fort stands as a silent watchman on one of these hills. This National Park is a combination of the fortified forest and the open chaparral land. The National Park is well known for wildlife photography.

Return to hotel for breakfast.

Time to relax in the pool or enjoy in house spa facility.

The spa lies under the spread of an ancient peepal tree, ensuring seclusion and privacy amidst a medley of birdsong. It offers variety of therapies ranging from a full body massage to long practiced reflexology treatments. Popular with guests after a journey on rural roads, the 'pot hole revival' is a huge hit.

Post lunch, proceed for afternoon private game drive into Ranthambore National Park.

Dinner at hotel (Beverages on direct).

Day 08

Ranthambore – Jaipur

0600 hours: Early morning game viewing at Ranthambore National Park by Private Jeep.
Return to hotel by 1000 hours.

Breakfast at hotel

11:30 hours: Transfer by road to Jaipur (approximately 03 hour and 30-minute drive).

Jaipur or The City of Victory, was first intended to be "Sawai Jaipur", named after the boy Prince who commissioned it - Maharaja Jai Singh II - a warrior, astronomer and politician who reigned over the Mughals from 1699 to 1743. Vidyadhar Bhattacharya, a grand visionary and architect, helped Jai Singh II design and develop his vision of the city. Jaipur was built according to a plan, with the glittering City Palace in the centre. Spreading around, in tiers, were public buildings, residences of noblemen, and the living and trading quarters of merchants and artisans.

Arrive at The Oberoi Rajvilas and check-in to your room.

The Oberoi Rajvilas, Jaipur reflects traditional Rajasthani architecture, complete with reflection pools and tranquil courtyards. Exquisite accommodation, including luxury tents inspired by the era of the Maharajas, fine dining restaurants serving authentic Rajasthani and international cuisines, specially curated romantic experiences and our heartfelt hospitality come together to create the perfect setting for an unforgettable holiday.



Evening at leisure- time available to enjoy the hotel in-house facilities.

Day 09

Jaipur

After breakfast, meet your local guide and proceed for Jaipur city tour. Begin your tour with visit to **Amber fort** for sightseeing tour (ascend and descend of fort by jeep).

Amber (pronounced Amer) is at a distance of about 11 kilometres from Jaipur. A UNESCO World Heritage Site, it was the bastion of the Kachwahas of Amber, until the capital was moved to the plains, to what is today Jaipur. The palace, located in craggy hills, is a beautiful melange of Hindu and Mughal styles. Made entirely of red sandstone and white marble, visitors are left spellbound by the magnificence of the palace that utilises carvings, precious stones and mirrors.



Panna Mina Step well – This eight storey step well was built in sixteenth century as a sort of community gathering area. A place where people could come for water, a swim, a chat with a neighbor or relax. The criss-cross of stairs, the octagonal gazebos, and the recessed doorways--this baoli is fun to walk around and photograph. According to the local residents of the place, it is impossible for a person to use the same stairs to get down and go upstairs. It is a big mystery of the place and all the tourists visiting here try to do this.

11:15h: Later proceed for rustic rural adventure in a Wilderness Camp. Have lunch in the wilderness, walk with the elephants, visit a local village – there are so many options to choose at



the camp tucked away in the foothills of the Aravali Range, just few miles from city, lies this camp, an usual experiment in wildlife conservation spearheaded by one Indian family.



Start your afternoon tour with a private guided tour of Jaipur city visiting **City Palace**, The **Observatory** and drive past the famous **Hawa Mahal** monument

Royal Splendour is a specially conducted tour of City Palace which gives visitors a chance to see the inner quarters of the Chandra Mahal, Rang Niwas, Pritam Niwas, Chhavi Niwas, Shobha Niwas, Sri Niwas, Mukut Mandir.

The City Palace in the centre of Jaipur took 04 years to complete. Tour the Palace by passing through the main entrance and begin by visiting the Mubarak Mahal, built in 1890 it houses the Textile and Costume Museum. Here the Diwan-i-Khas is home to 2 giant silver urns used by Sawai Madho Singh to carry Ganges water to England when he attended Queen Victoria's Diamond Jubilee.





Visit **Jantar Mantar Observatory** built between 1728 and 1734 on a grand scale, the 17 astronomical instruments were built in stone and marble.



Finally, **photo stop** at the **Hawa Mahal**. This unique building also known as the “Palace of the Winds” is a Jaipur landmark and was once used by the ladies of the court to watch the daily goings-on in the street below.

You may explore the local market or return to hotel.

Day 10

Jaipur – Deogarh

Later check-out and drive to Deogarh covering distance of 300 Kms in approx 6-7hrs.

Arrive and check-in at hotel – **Dev Shree**.

Dev Shree luxury homestay in Deogarh, Rajasthan has the advantage of being a newly built home, but with traditional Rajasthan architecture and character. In the words of one of the guests “gone is the musty, dusty feel so often associated with traditional rural properties.



In addition it is situated in a rural location, on the edge of the Ragho Sagar Lake with the Gokul Fort at its far end, perched on a hill. The large verandahs overlook the lawn which stretches out to the water infusing a sense of calm. It is a wonderful way to visit off beat Rajasthan and explore this tiny town, enjoy walks at sundown and sit around the campfire chatting to the family.

The host will be glad to welcome you at Dev Shree and brief about property and activities can be experiences while stay at their home.

Evening proceed for **Artisan village walk**.

Step into the world of Deogarh's artisans, exploring local crafts right outside Dev Shree's gates. From pottery to miniature artistry, delve into a vibrant cultural tapestry. End your walk amidst the bustling local market, where antiquities await your discovery.

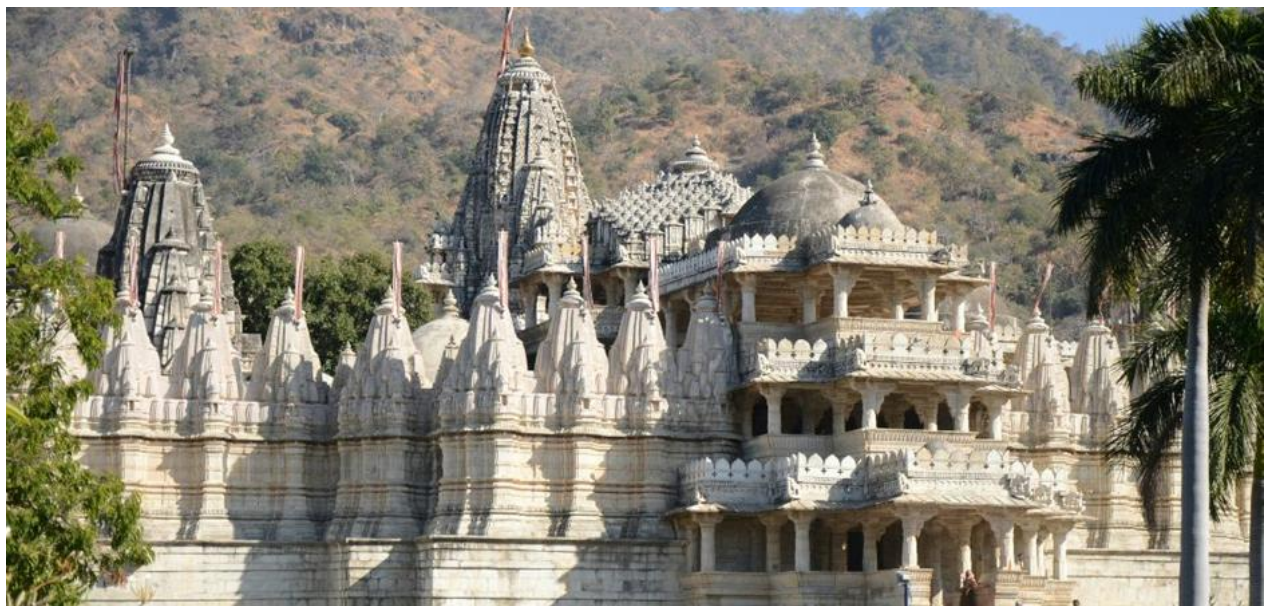
Day 12

Deogarh – Udaipur

Breakfast at hotel.

Later check-out and drive to Udaipur covering distance of 135 Kms in approx 2 – 3hrs.



En-route visit to **Ranakpur Jain Temple (Audio guide only).**

Ranakpur temple was named after the renowned ruler of Mewar, Rana Kumbha.

Made entirely of white marble, this temple instils awe with its engraved designs and grandeur. It was built in the fifteenth century took around sixty-five years to complete. The basement of this colossal temple is spread over 48000 sq. ft. There are more than 1444 marble pillars embellished with complex carvings and no two pillars are alike.

After visit, continue your drive to Udaipur.

Udaipur - Romantic, wistful and serene Udaipur - a city built around shimmering, clear blue water lakes which reflect the green hills of the Aravali ranges. The famous lake palaces that seem to emerge from the placid Lake Pichola, whisper the memories of a bygone era. Built in 1567 by



Maharana Udai Singh, the city of Udaipur is assimilated around three lakes - Pichola, Fateh Sagar and Udai Sagar. The city was the last capital of Mewar, and remained so till the state was merged with the Republic of India in 1947.

Upon arrival, at Udaipur airport, meet & greet and transfer to hotel (approx – 45 minutes).

Arrive and check-in at hotel- **The Oberoi Udaivilas.**

Falling in love with the charm of the “City of Lakes” is easy when you are staying at the best hotel in Udaipur: Located on the banks of Lake Pichola, Oberoi Udaivilas is spread over 1,21,406 square metres of luxuriant gardens, with an intricate layout of interconnecting domes and corridors that reflect the layout of Udaipur itself; whose seven lakes are linked by canals.

Saheliyon Ki Bari: The Saheliyon ki Bari or the garden of the Maids of Honor is situated in the north of the city. It is a small exquisite garden with fountains, stone elephants and a beautiful lotus pond.

Return to hotel for lunch break and relax or enjoy spa at hotel on your own.

Transfer to the lake side for an evening boat cruise (Private) on Lake Pichola with tea/coffee at Jagmandir Island (Subject to permission).



The shimmering waters of the Lake with the City Palace and the Lake Palace buildings in the background, serve as a magical way to end your day in Udaipur.

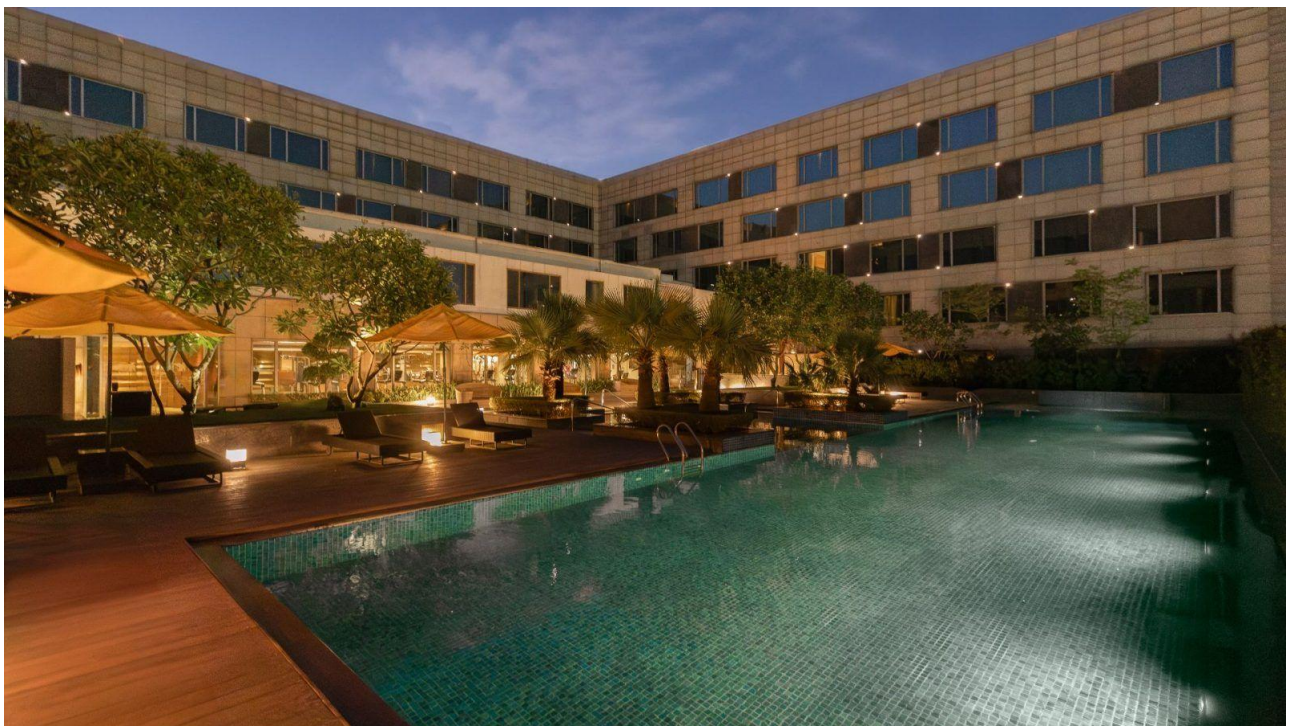
