**GOD GIVES ME ENOUGH
FOR THE NEXT STEP**

The Israelites did evil in the eyes of the Lord, and for seven years he gave them into the hands of the Midianites. Because the power of Midian was so oppressive, the Israelites prepared shelters for themselves in mountain clefts, caves and strongholds. Judges 6:1-2 (NIV)

The angel of the Lord came and sat down under the oak...that belonged to Joash..., where his son Gideon was threshing wheat in a winepress to keep it from the Midianites. When the angel of the Lord appeared to Gideon, he said, "The Lord is with you, mighty warrior." "Pardon me, my lord," Gideon replied, "but if the Lord is with us, why has all this happened to us? Where are all his wonders that our ancestors told us about when they said, 'Did not the Lord bring us up out of Egypt?' But now the Lord has abandoned us and given us into the hand of Midian." Judges 6:11-13

The Lord turned to him and said, "Go in the strength you have and save Israel out of Midian's hand. Am I not sending you?" "Pardon me, my lord," Gideon replied, "but how can I save Israel? My clan is the weakest in Manasseh, and I am the least in my family." The Lord answered, "I will be with you, and you will strike down all the Midianites, leaving none alive." Judges 6:14-16 (NIV)

That same night the Lord said to him, ... Tear down your father's altar to Baal and cut down the Asherah pole beside it. Then build a proper kind of altar to the Lord your God ... Judges 6:25-26 (NIV)

Now all the Midianites, Amalekites and other eastern peoples joined forces and crossed over the Jordan and camped in the Valley of Jezreel. Then the Spirit of the Lord came on Gideon... Judges 6:33-34

The Lord said to Gideon, "You have too many men. I cannot deliver Midian into their hands, or Israel would boast against me, 'My own strength has saved me.' Judges 7:2 (NIV)

..."My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. 2 Corinthians 12:8-9 (NIV)

When Gideon heard the dream and its interpretation, he bowed down and worshiped. He returned to the camp of Israel and called out, "Get up! The Lord has given the Midianite camp into your hands." Judges 7:15

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1. God MEETS me WHERE I am.

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2. God FORMS MY HEART before he CHANGES my circumstances.

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DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

CONNECT

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Describe a season when you wanted God to show you the whole plan before you were willing to take the first step.

ENGAGE

What stood out to you most from the message, “God Gives Me Enough for the Next Step”?
Gideon asked, “If the Lord is with us, why has all this happened?” (Judges 6:13).

Why do you think God responded with His presence (“I will be with you”) instead of giving Gideon a full explanation?

What questions are you currently tempted to ask God that may be similar to Gideon’s?

GROW

The message emphasized that God often forms our hearts before He changes our circumstances. Have you experienced that? What was God teaching you?

Gideon was told to tear down the altar to Baal before facing the Midianites. Why do you think God addressed Gideon’s worship before addressing his circumstances?

The message suggested modern ‘altars’ might include control, certainty, success, comfort, approval, or productivity. Which of those are you most tempted to trust instead of God?

Paul writes, ‘My grace is sufficient for you’ (2 Corinthians 12:9). How does God’s promise of His presence give you courage even when your circumstances don’t change?

CHALLENGE:

What’s the next faithful step God may be inviting you to take this week?
As you spend time with the Lord this week, consider asking:

1. Is there an altar I need to tear down so my heart can belong more fully to God?
2. Where have I been waiting for certainty instead of walking by faith?
3. What step of obedience have I been delaying because I want more answers?
4. How can I intentionally remember God’s promise: ‘I will be with you’?

This week, take the next faithful step.
If God is with you, that is enough.
