# Midtown & Downtown

## where the city wakes up

### MIDTOWN SACRAMENTO

for slow mornings + good people-watching

#### Temple Coffee

2829 S Street, Sacramento

If Sacramento coffee has a hometown hero, it's Temple. Calm space, beautifully made coffee, and one of the rare spots that stays open late. Try: the Mexican Mocha — it's the one we keep coming back for.

#### Philz Coffee

1725 R St, Sacramento

A Midtown classic, and for good reason. Every drink is hand-poured one cup at a time, and the food menu quietly holds its own. Try: the Philtered Soul — sweet, creamy, and the one we always come back to. ❤️

#### Seasons Coffee Roasters

2420 N Street #105, Sacramento

Tucked inside the Cora Auditorium building. Cozy, bookish, full of beautiful little things to browse. Try: the earl grey matcha or a flat white.

#### Chloé Cà Phê + Roastery

2521 Jazz Alley, Sacramento

Vietnamese coffee culture done beautifully. Often a vintage Porsche parked inside (we're not kidding). Try: the rose cream latte or the matcha cloud.

#### Concept Coffee

1912 P Street, Sacramento

One of midtown's newer spots and already a darling. The space alone is worth the visit. Try: the maple bourbon latte and the avocado toast (truly some of the best in the city).

# Downtown, land park & east sac

## DOWNTOWN SACRAMENTO

a city coffee with character

### Burnside Coffee Bar

902 K Street, Sacramento

*If you love a really good cup of coffee, this is the place. Everything is hand-made, the space is calm and pretty, and the breakfast actually impressed us — the avocado toast is so good. Try: the cortado. ❤️*

### Camellia Coffee Roasters

1200 R Street #130, Sacramento

Bright, welcoming, and buzzy in the best way. The breakfast sandwich is famous for a reason. **Try:** the flat white + the breakfast sandwich combo.

## LAND PARK

tucked-away neighborhood gems

### 5 Sips Coffee & Tea

2104 11th Avenue, Sacramento

All the energy of a neighborhood favorite — open early, open late, welcoming to everyone. **Try:** the cinnamon honeyfroth latte and coffee cake.

### Brew Bird

3193 Riverside Boulevard, Sacramento

A coffee shop with a paint-and-sip pottery studio inside. Genuinely fun. Right next to Vic's Ice Cream — make it a whole afternoon. **Try:** the iced vanilla latte while you paint.

# Elk Grove

## a south-side love letter

### ELK GROVE

south of the city, full of good things

#### Common Coffee

*9645 Elk Grove Florin Road, Elk Grove*

The newest darling of Elk Grove — family-friendly with an outdoor playground for the kids while you sip.

**Try:** the Canela latte (ask for it less sweet).

#### Tule Coffeehouse

*9098 Elk Grove Boulevard, Elk Grove*

A cottage-style spot on Old Town's Main Street that locals would drive across town for. **Try:** the seasonal latte and don't forget to grab a breakfast sandwich.


#### Xulo Coffee Bar

*8698 Elk Grove Boulevard, Elk Grove*

Warm, home-y, with breakfast that looks (and tastes) like a small work of art. **Try:** the Dulce De Leche Latte and grab some french toast.

#### Sana'a Cafe

*9135 W Stockton Boulevard #140, Elk Grove*

This place is such a vibe — the interior is gorgeous, the staff is the sweetest, and the whole experience feels a little fancy in the best way. Yemeni coffee, beautiful pastries, and tea served on a little tabletop burner. **Try:** the Adeni chai and the orange blossom cake. 

#### Rescate Coffee

*2475 Elk Grove Boulevard #160, Elk Grove*

A specialty drink menu with personality. Open early for the 6am crowd. **Try:** the Mayan Mocha — a little spicy, all good.

# Folsom

## historic charm & great coffee

### FOLSOM

old town meets new favorites

#### Fourscore Coffee

*604 Sutter Street #190, Folsom*

Right in the heart of historic Sutter Street. A perfect post-walk coffee. **Try:** the Americano (consistently nailed) and the jalapeño scones.

#### Sociology Coffee Bar

*705 Gold Lake Drive #390, Folsom*

Creative drinks, seasonal syrups, and a sourdough so good you'll want to take a loaf home. The kind of menu that genuinely surprises you. **Try:** the Tesora (hot) and the house sandwich on homemade sourdough.

#### Kingdom Coffee Roasters

*305 Iron Point Road, Folsom*

Spacious, friendly, with their own roasted beans. Low-acid, smooth, the kind of cup that makes you a regular. **Try:** the honey cinnamon latte and the egg sandwich.

#### Chocolate Fish

*25055 Blue Ravine Rd, Suite 100, Folsom*

*So good. They roast their own beans and the coffee is always fresh — you can taste it. Try: the white chocolate mocha.*

#### Coffee Republic

*6610 Folsom-Auburn Road #2, Folsom*

*Great coffee, big cups, fair prices, and the cutest dog-friendly patio. Try: the chai and one of their sandwiches — both genuinely good. ❤️*

# Roseville

## downtowncharm & modern faves

### ROSEVILLE

for every kind of morning

#### Fourscore Coffee

*327 Lincoln Street, Roseville*

Downtown Roseville's quiet showstopper. Open at 6am for the early crowd. **Try:** the cappuccino — they really know what they're doing.

#### The Fig Tree Coffee, Art & Music Lounge

*217 Vernon Street, Roseville*

A coffee shop that doubles as an art and live music venue. Vintage art, open mic nights, the most home-y vibe. **Try:** a latte and whatever pastry just came out of the oven.

#### Shady Coffee & Tea

*325 Douglas Boulevard, Roseville*

Like sitting in someone's living room — plants, art, and the warmest service. **Try:** the matcha with coconut.

#### Haute Coffee

*4000 Foothills Boulevard, Roseville*

Beautiful, modern, and open until midnight on weekends — a rare gift. **Try:** the iced strawberry matcha on a warm afternoon.

#### Bloom Coffee & Kitchen

*1485 Eureka Road #100, Roseville*

A hidden gem with the coziest neighborhood feel — house-made syrups, beautiful lattes, and a full kitchen that nails breakfast. **Try:** the bourbon oat milk latte and the breakfast burrito with goat cheese and avocado (ask for chipotle aioli).

# Rocklin, Granite Bay, & Loomis

## ROCKLIN

specialty + small-town heart

### Placer Roasting Company

*4780 Granite Drive #300, Rocklin*

A hidden gem with a perfect ambiance for both deep work and slow lingering. The owner is the kind of person you'll end up chatting with. **Try:** the salted caramel latte or their house chai.

### Pause Coffee House

*2168 Sunset Boulevard, Rocklin*

A loft-style spot with the best fresh-pressed juices alongside great coffee. Multiple locations, all worth it. **Try:** the Tropical Beet Blast juice and a vanilla latte.

### Toastique

*5418 Crossings Drive, Rocklin*

Authentic Turkish cafe with the real-deal coffee, salmon simit, and lokum. **Try:** the Turkish pistachio coffee.

## GRANITE BAY

a quiet little favorite

### Pause Coffee House (Granite Bay area)

*multiple Placer County locations*

Pause's locations across Placer County are all worth a stop — Granite Bay locals love them for the consistency. Check Loomis and Rocklin spots, both close by.

## Flower Farm Cafe

*9280 Horseshoe Bar Road, Loomis*

A working flower farm with a cafe attached. Brunch in the garden, mimosas with fresh-pressed orange juice — pure golden-hour energy. **Try:** the brown sugar latte + the tomato bisque on a cool morning.

## Smithville & Co

*3637 Taylor Road, Loomis*

Such a cute spot in Loomis — they make really good coffee (using Temple beans!), the breakfast burrito has a whole following, and they even have protein shakes if that's your thing.

# Auburn

## oldtown, foothill mornings

### AUBURN

historic + delicious

#### The Pour Choice

*177 Sacramento Street, Auburn*

Old Town Auburn's stunner — coffee in the morning, beer and wine by night. Houses-made pastries and syrups. **Try:** the bourbon latte + the Parmesan leek pastry.

#### Depoe Bay Coffee Roasters

*893 High Street, Auburn*

A beloved local with a giant roasting machine right in the shop. The kind of place you become a regular at by accident. **Try:** the Sunrise breakfast sandwich and a blended caramel macchiato.

#### Hidden Coffee Bar

*160 Cleveland Avenue, Auburn*

Tiny, tucked-away, family-run — and they offer raw milk in your coffee (rare!). Worth seeking out. **Try:** the raw milk Gibraltar and a strawberry basil scone.

#### Missions Coffee

*2405 Grass Valley Highway, Auburn*

Family-run, warm, with shelves of cute things you'll want to take home. **Try:** the London Fog and a breakfast burrito.

#### Baked & Brewed Cafe

*958 Lincoln Way, Auburn*

Right downtown — the biscuit with house-made mango hot sauce is unforgettable. **Try:** a biscuit + their blended mocha.

# El Dorado Hills

great coffee, neighborhood feel

## EL DORADO HILLS

the good stuff, hill-side

### World Traveler Coffee Roasters

*4364 Town Center Boulevard, El Dorado Hills*

Right in Town Center — perfect for grabbing a latte before walking the shops. **Try:** the avocado toast (truly excellent) and any latte with their seasonal syrup.

### Proxy International Coffee Co.

*931 Lassen Lane, El Dorado Hills*

A little hidden gem — they make their own syrups, source thoughtful beans, and put their hearts into every cup. **Try:** the chai tea latte.

### Double Shot Coffee Bar

*3381 Bass Lake Road #100, El Dorado Hills*

A true neighborhood spot — the kind of place where the owners know your name by visit two. **Try:** the cold brew and the croissant sandwich.

### Bakerie & Latte Chateau Arme


*2222 Francisco Drive #500, El Dorado Hills*

A bakery-cafe hybrid that will (in their words) "ruin your life" — in the best way. Everything made fresh, daily. **Try:** a fresh croissant and a cappuccino with a hint of chocolate.
